2010 Voluntary Water Conservation Measures

Landscape and Lawn Watering:

Watering* is allowed between 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.

The *North Section* of town: water on Wednesdays; Fridays; Sundays

The *South Section* of town: water on Tuesdays; Thursdays; Saturdays

(Boundaries—Cherry Creek Road; Citrus Fair Drive; Cloverdale Blvd)

Easy Tips to Conserve:

(The American Waterworks Association)

- Don't leave the faucet running while you brush your teeth
- Fully load the dishwasher and clothes washer before running them
- Use native or drought-resistant plants in your landscaping
- Repair dripping faucets & leaky toilets
- Install water-efficient appliances
- Don't over-water your lawn, and water early in the morning or at night
- Use a broom instead of a hose to clean the driveway or sidewalk
- If you have a swimming pool, use a cover. This cuts evaporation by 90%
- Don't overuse pesticides or fertilizers
- Place rainbarrels beneath your downspouts

Non-essential Uses of Water*:

- May be done at any time of the day, but only on the days allowed for your property
- The hose used for rinsing must be equipped with a shut-off nozzle

*includes washing privately-owned motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outdoor furniture
